Findings for 2025–26

Generated directly from the published results — every statement below can be checked against the tables in this report.

Science lost 4.4 points

69.9% of students scored Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, down from 74.3% in 2024–25.

The Students with Disabilities gap in Math narrowed by 18.6 points

Students with Disabilities sat 43.9 points behind Students without Disabilities in 2024–25, and 25.3 points behind them in 2025–26.

Grade 5 Math lost 6.3 points

68.0% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, down from 74.3% in 2024–25.

Science is 31.7 points above the state

Frances Meeks Elementary School reported 69.9% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26; Georgia reported 38.2%.

Science is 18.0 points above the Bryan County average

69.9% here vs. 51.9% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26.

Math gained 1.8 points

72.6% of students scored Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, up from 70.8% in 2024–25.

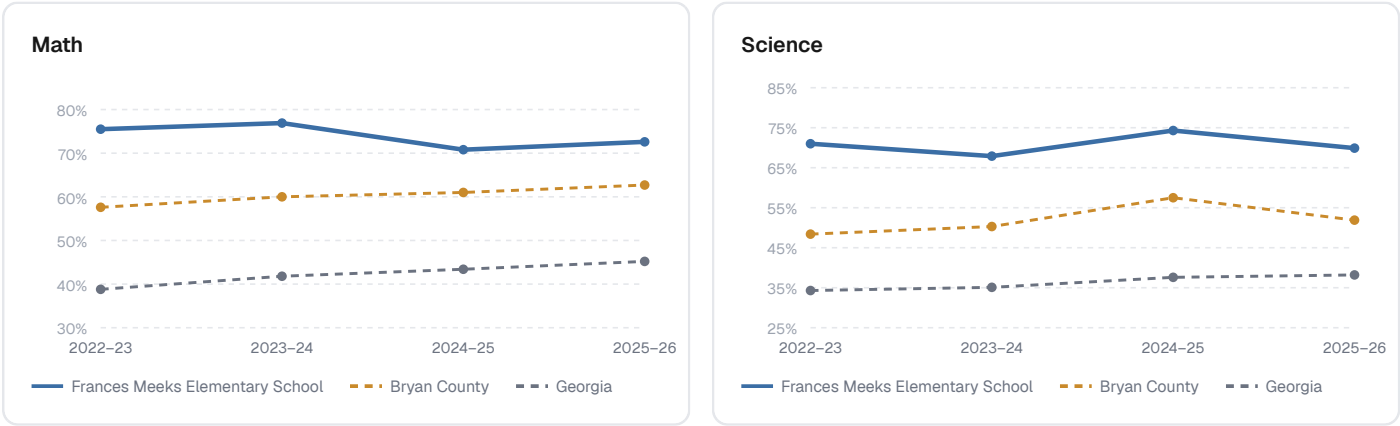
