WHAT STANDS OUT

Findings for 2025–26

Generated directly from the published results — every statement below can be checked against the tables in this report.

Algebra: C&C gained 25.9 points

100.0% of students scored Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, up from 74.1% in 2024–25.

Math has moved in one direction for 4 straight years

16.8% → 21.6% → 25.9% → 28.9% across 2022–23, 2023–24, 2024–25, 2025–26 (+12.1 pts overall).

The Students with Disabilities gap in Social Studies widened by 16.2 points

Students with Disabilities sat 11.1 points behind Students without Disabilities in 2024–25, and 27.3 points behind them in 2025–26.

Grade 8 Math gained 6.5 points

41.0% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, up from 34.5% in 2024–25.

Algebra: C&C is 51.9 points above the state

Langston Chapel Middle School reported 100.0% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26; Georgia reported 48.1%.

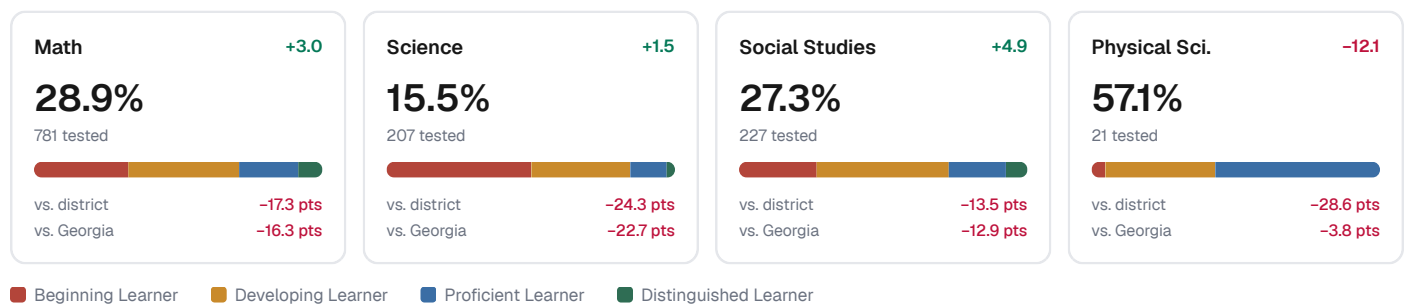
Algebra: C&C is 52.1 points above the Bulloch County average

Performance by subject

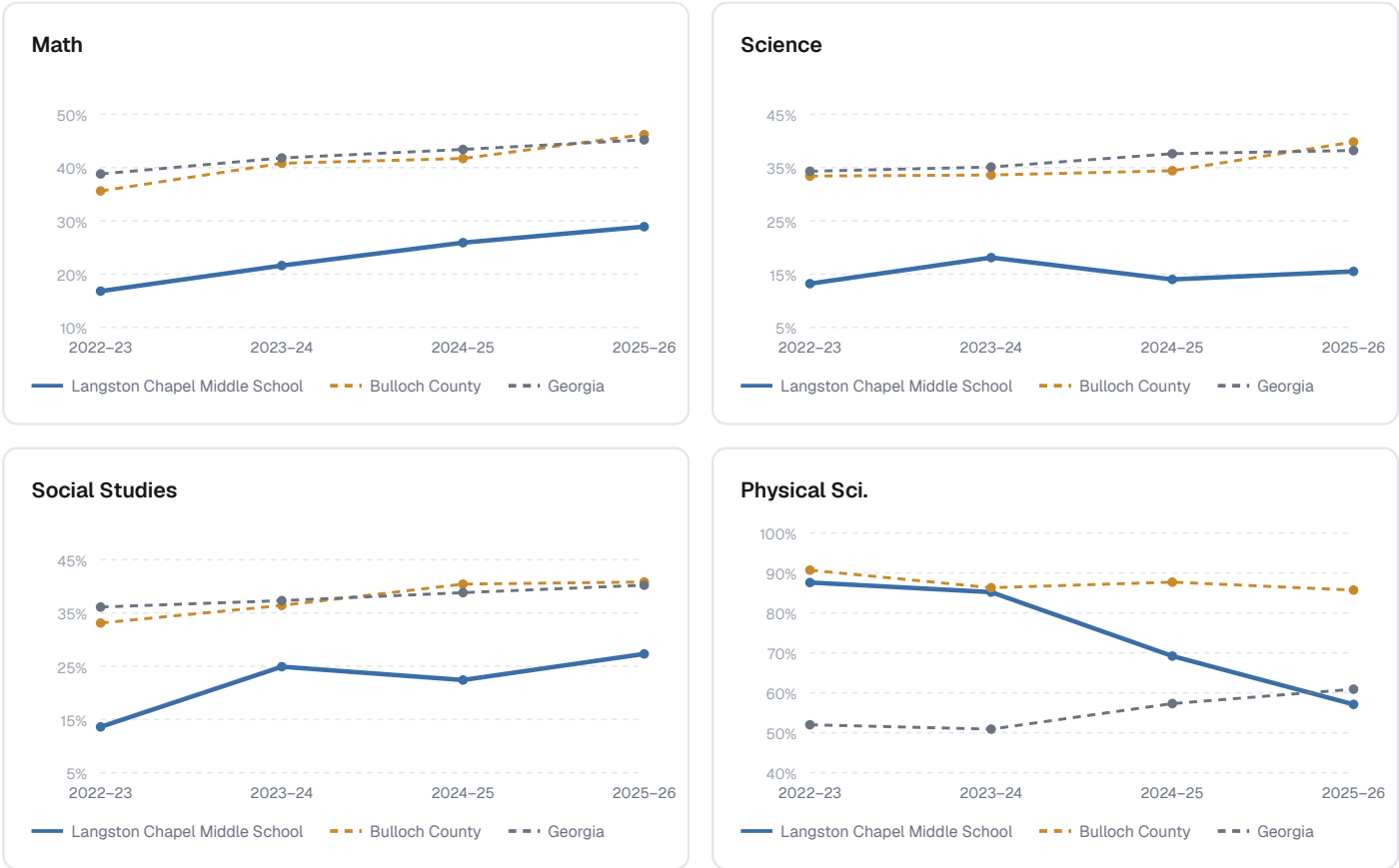
Percent of students scoring Proficient or Distinguished, with the change from last year and the distance to the district and state averages.
