Findings for 2025–26

Generated directly from the published results — every statement below can be checked against the tables in this report.

Science gained 11.0 points

74.1% of students scored Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, up from 63.1% in 2024–25.

Science has moved in one direction for 4 straight years

60.0% → 62.9% → 63.1% → 74.1% across 2022–23, 2023–24, 2024–25, 2025–26 (+14.1 pts overall).

The Students with Disabilities gap in Math widened by 14.5 points

Students with Disabilities sat 46.0 points behind Students without Disabilities in 2024–25, and 60.5 points behind them in 2025–26.

Grade 5 Science gained 11.0 points

74.1% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, up from 63.1% in 2024–25.

Science is 35.9 points above the state

Mamie Lou Gross Elementary School reported 74.1% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26; Georgia reported 38.2%.

Science is 13.9 points above the Camden County average

74.1% here vs. 60.2% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26.

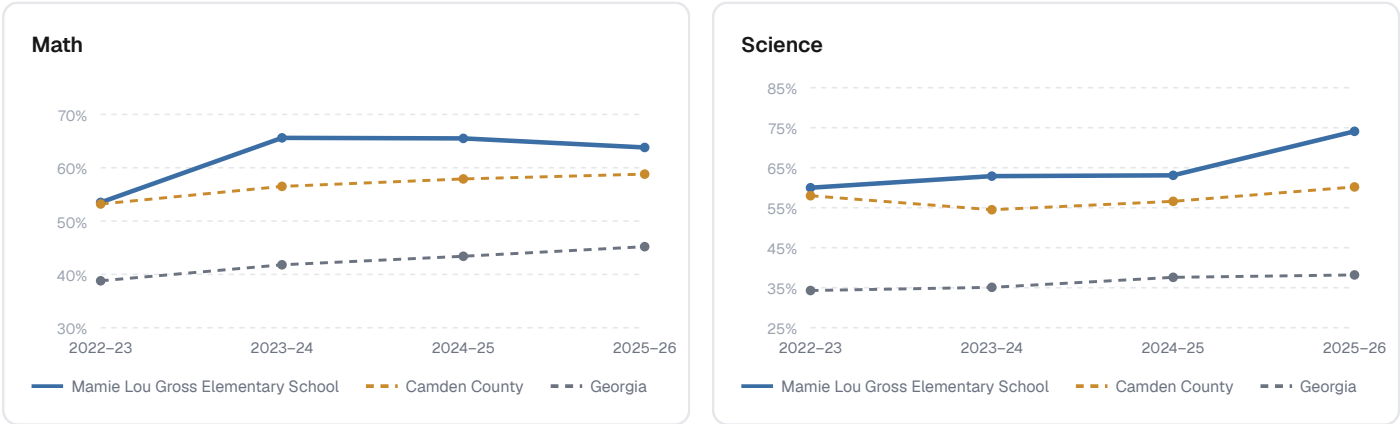
