WHAT STANDS OUT

Findings for 2025–26

Generated directly from the published results — every statement below can be checked against the tables in this report.

Math gained 3.0 points

69.1% of students scored Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, up from 66.1% in 2024–25.

The Students with Disabilities gap in Math widened by 6.5 points

Students with Disabilities sat 36.9 points behind Students without Disabilities in 2024–25, and 43.4 points behind them in 2025–26.

Grade 3 Math gained 13.9 points

77.5% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, up from 63.6% in 2024–25.

Science is 37.7 points above the state

Matilda Harris Elementary School reported 75.9% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26; Georgia reported 38.2%.

Science is 15.7 points above the Camden County average

75.9% here vs. 60.2% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26.

Grade 4 Math lost 7.8 points

65.9% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, down from 73.7% in 2024–25.

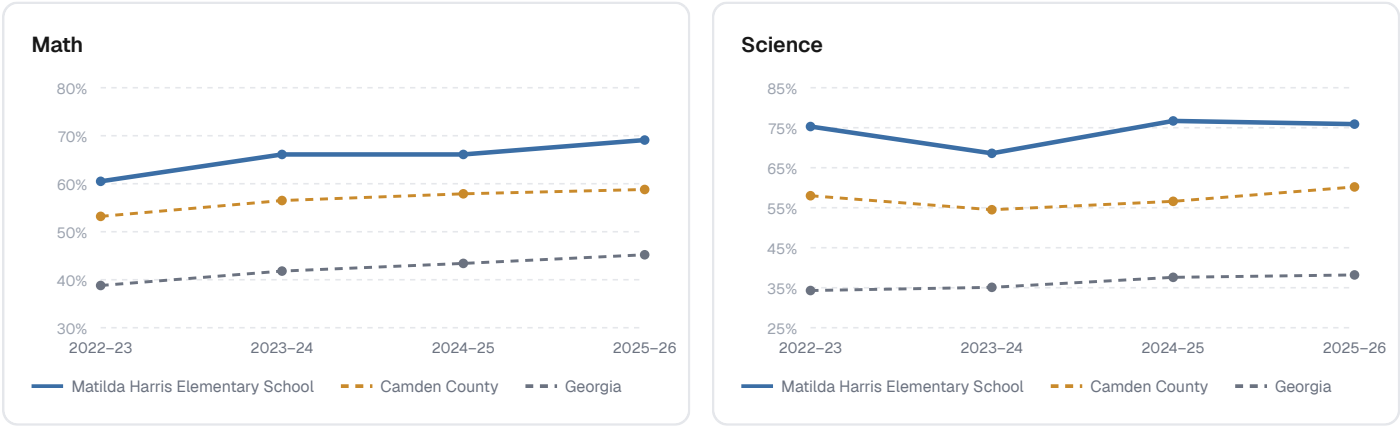
