WHAT STANDS OUT

Findings for 2025–26

Generated directly from the published results — every statement below can be checked against the tables in this report.

Science lost 6.0 points

61.8% of students scored Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, down from 67.8% in 2024–25.

Math has moved in one direction for 4 straight years

63.5% → 63.0% → 62.5% → 61.2% across 2022–23, 2023–24, 2024–25, 2025–26 (–2.3 pts overall).

The Students with Disabilities gap in Math narrowed by 7.7 points

Students with Disabilities sat 36.2 points behind Students without Disabilities in 2024–25, and 28.5 points behind them in 2025–26.

Grade 3 Math lost 17.8 points

48.9% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, down from 66.7% in 2024–25.

Science is 23.6 points above the state

Sugarmill Elementary reported 61.8% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26; Georgia reported 38.2%.

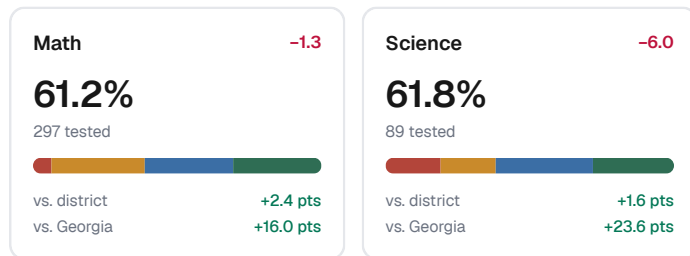
Math lost 1.3 points

61.2% of students scored Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, down from 62.5% in 2024–25.

Percent of students scoring Proficient or Distinguished, with the change from last year and the distance to the district and state averages.

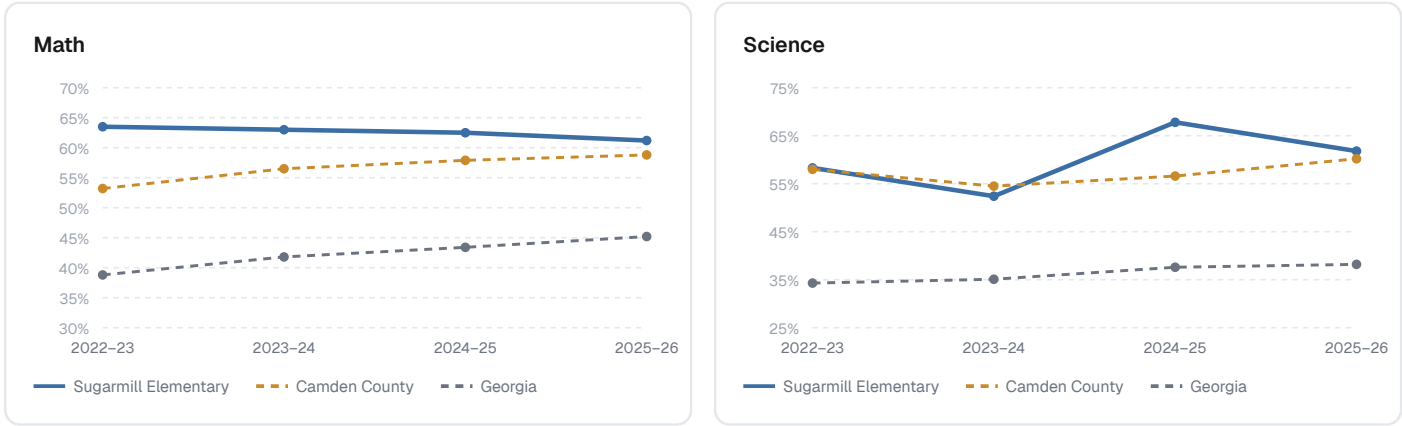


■ Beginning Learner
