Findings for 2025–26

Generated directly from the published results — every statement below can be checked against the tables in this report.

Science lost 5.1 points

42.2% of students scored Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, down from 47.3% in 2024–25.

Grade 5 Math lost 18.7 points

31.9% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, down from 50.6% in 2024–25.

Math is 9.5 points below the state

Metter Elementary School reported 35.7% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26; Georgia reported 45.2%.

Science is 8.8 points above the Candler County average

42.2% here vs. 33.4% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26.

Grade 4 Math gained 12.3 points

39.9% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, up from 27.6% in 2024–25.

Science is 4.0 points above the state

Metter Elementary School reported 42.2% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26; Georgia reported 38.2%.

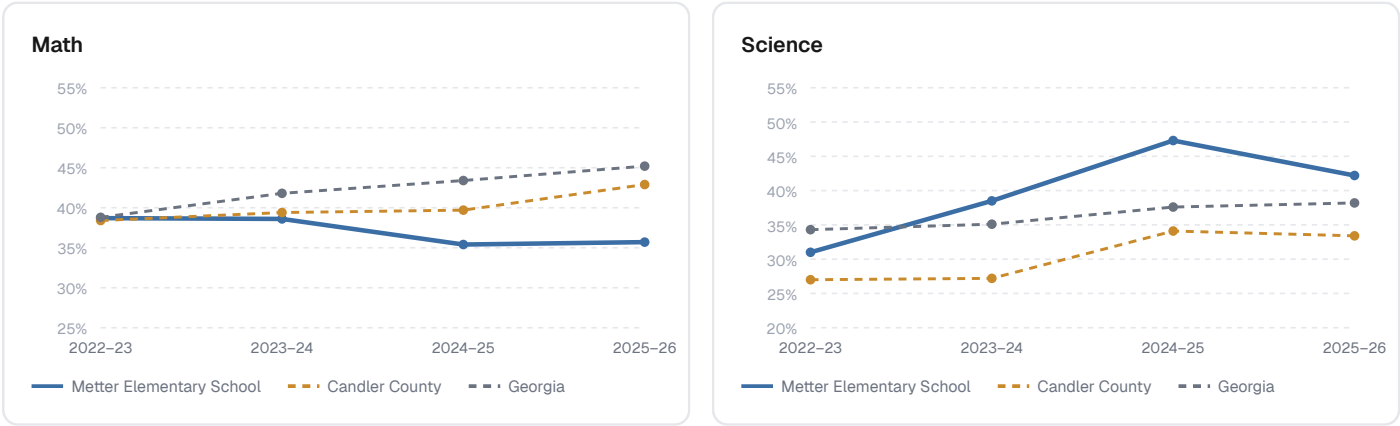
