Findings for 2025–26

Generated directly from the published results — every statement below can be checked against the tables in this report.

Social Studies lost 14.2 points

9.1% of students scored Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, down from 23.3% in 2024–25.

Math has moved in one direction for 4 straight years

37.9% → 40.2% → 43.5% → 49.5% across 2022–23, 2023–24, 2024–25, 2025–26 (+11.6 pts overall).

The Students with Disabilities gap in Social Studies narrowed by 16.2 points

Students with Disabilities sat 26.8 points behind Students without Disabilities in 2024–25, and 10.6 points behind them in 2025–26.

Grade 8 Social Studies lost 14.2 points

9.1% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, down from 23.3% in 2024–25.

Algebra: C&C is 40.7 points above the state

Metter Middle School reported 88.8% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26; Georgia reported 48.1%.

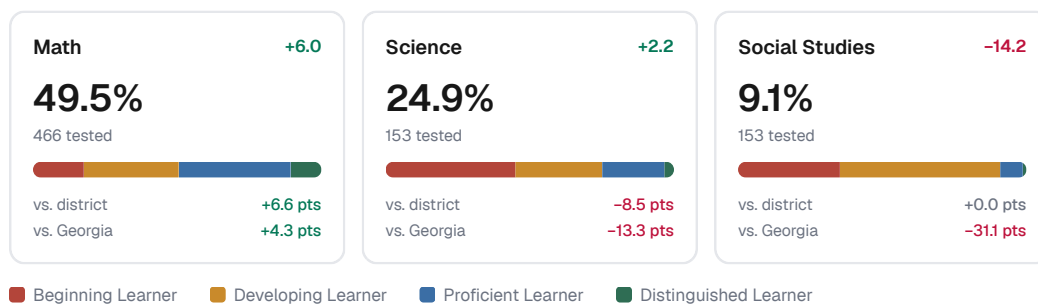
Algebra: C&C is 59.1 points above the Candler County average
