WHAT STANDS OUT

Findings for 2025–26

Generated directly from the published results — every statement below can be checked against the tables in this report.

Science lost 7.1 points

38.7% of students scored Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, down from 45.8% in 2024–25.

The Students with Disabilities gap in Math narrowed by 7.9 points

Students with Disabilities sat 25.5 points behind Students without Disabilities in 2024–25, and 17.6 points behind them in 2025–26.

Grade 5 Math lost 11.7 points

34.9% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, down from 46.6% in 2024–25.

Science is 10.1 points below the Effingham County average

38.7% here vs. 48.8% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26.

Math lost 4.9 points

47.6% of students scored Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, down from 52.5% in 2024–25.

Grade 4 Math lost 7.9 points

48.4% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, down from 56.3% in 2024–25.

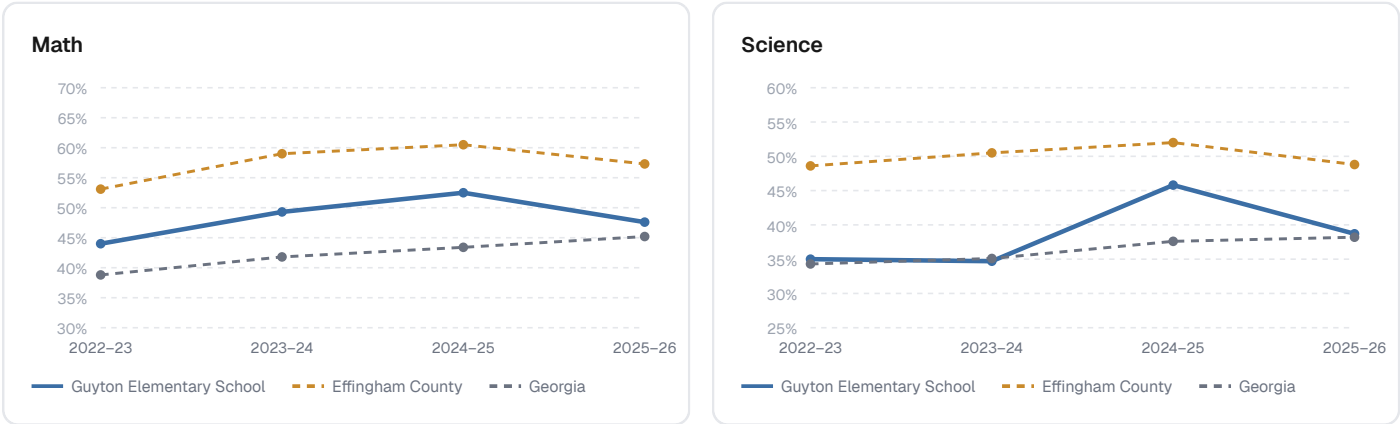
