## WHAT STANDS OUT

### Findings for 2025–26

Generated directly from the published results — every statement below can be checked against the tables in this report.

#### Science lost 16.5 points

50.8% of students scored Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, down from 67.3% in 2024–25.

#### Science has moved in one direction for 4 straight years

69.7% → 69.5% → 67.3% → 50.8% across 2022–23, 2023–24, 2024–25, 2025–26 (–18.9 pts overall).

#### The Students with Disabilities gap in Math widened by 3.8 points

Students with Disabilities sat 38.5 points behind Students without Disabilities in 2024–25, and 42.3 points behind them in 2025–26.

#### Grade 5 Science lost 16.5 points

50.8% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, down from 67.3% in 2024–25.

#### Math is 15.1 points above the state

Marlow Elementary School reported 60.3% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26; Georgia reported 45.2%.

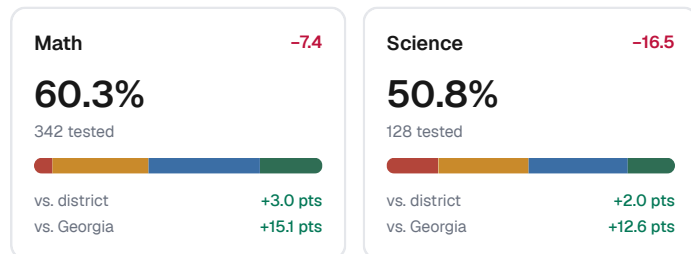
#### Math lost 7.4 points

60.3% of students scored Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, down from 67.7% in 2024–25.

Percent of students scoring Proficient or Distinguished, with the change from last year and the distance to the district and state averages.

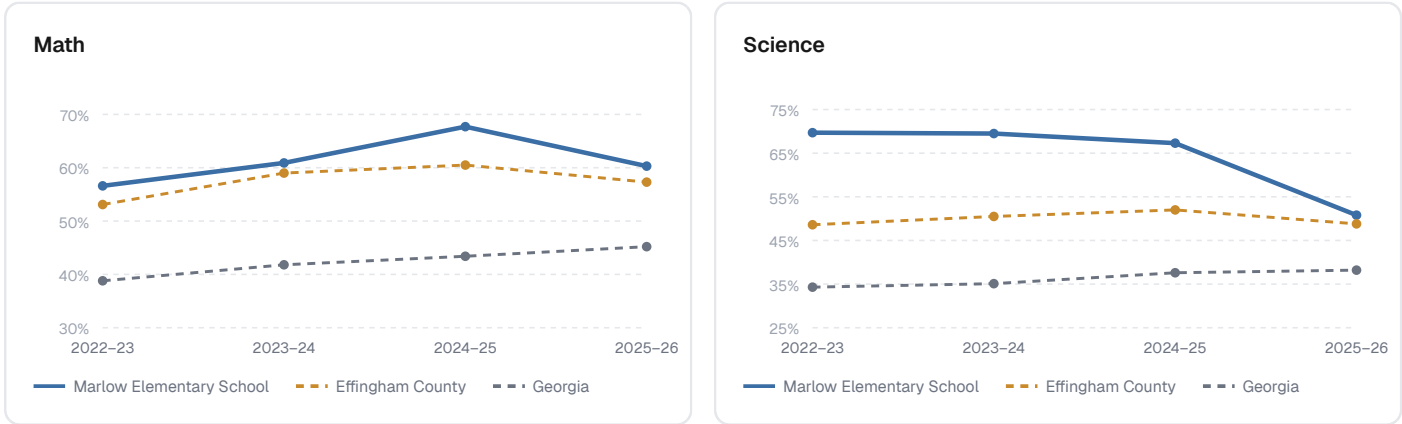


■ Beginning Learner
