## WHAT STANDS OUT

### Findings for 2025–26

Generated directly from the published results — every statement below can be checked against the tables in this report.

#### Science gained 21.3 points

32.8% of students scored Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, up from 11.5% in 2024–25.

#### Math has moved in one direction for 4 straight years

14.3% → 20.9% → 29.5% → 29.9% across 2022–23, 2023–24, 2024–25, 2025–26 (+15.6 pts overall).

#### The Limited English Proficient gap in Math widened by 9.1 points

Limited English Proficient sat 19.4 points behind Not Limited English Proficient in 2024–25, and 28.5 points behind them in 2025–26.

#### Grade 5 Science gained 21.3 points

32.8% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, up from 11.5% in 2024–25.

#### Math is 15.3 points below the state

Goodyear Elementary School reported 29.9% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26; Georgia reported 45.2%.

#### Math is 19.0 points below the Glynn County average

29.9% here vs. 48.9% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26.

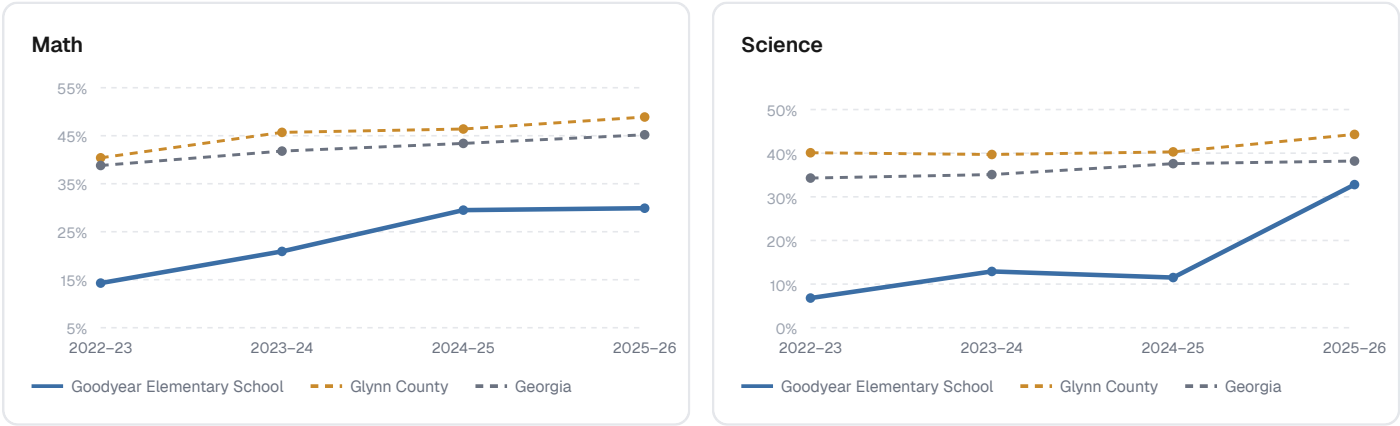
