WHAT STANDS OUT

Findings for 2025–26

Generated directly from the published results — every statement below can be checked against the tables in this report.

Science gained 5.0 points

37.5% of students scored Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, up from 32.5% in 2024–25.

The Limited English Proficient gap in Math narrowed by 18.2 points

Limited English Proficient sat 33.5 points behind Not Limited English Proficient in 2024–25, and 15.3 points behind them in 2025–26.

Science is 6.8 points below the Glynn County average

37.5% here vs. 44.3% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26.

Math gained 3.8 points

45.8% of students scored Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, up from 42.0% in 2024–25.

The Students with Disabilities gap in Math widened by 7.2 points

Students with Disabilities sat 25.7 points behind Students without Disabilities in 2024–25, and 32.9 points behind them in 2025–26.

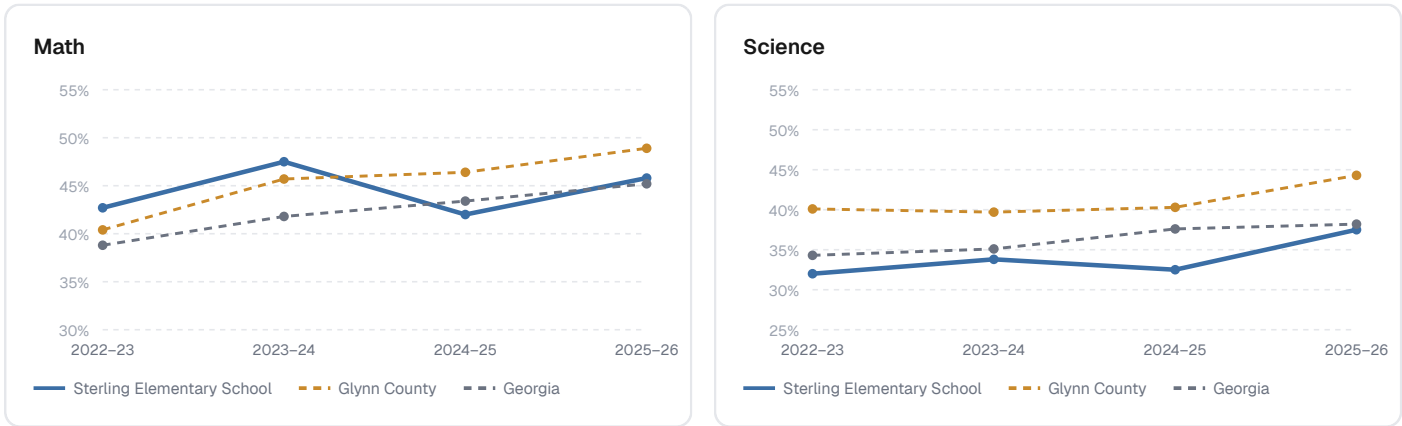
