## WHAT STANDS OUT

### Findings for 2025–26

Generated directly from the published results — every statement below can be checked against the tables in this report.

#### Science lost 11.8 points

21.5% of students scored Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, down from 33.3% in 2024–25.

#### Science has moved in one direction for 4 straight years

47.7% → 37.5% → 33.3% → 21.5% across 2022–23, 2023–24, 2024–25, 2025–26 (–26.2 pts overall).

#### Grade 4 Math gained 16.6 points

39.6% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, up from 23.0% in 2024–25.

#### Science is 16.7 points below the state

Joseph Martin Elementary School reported 21.5% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26; Georgia reported 38.2%.

#### Science is 7.2 points below the Liberty County average

21.5% here vs. 28.7% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26.

#### Math gained 4.8 points

34.9% of students scored Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, up from 30.1% in 2024–25.

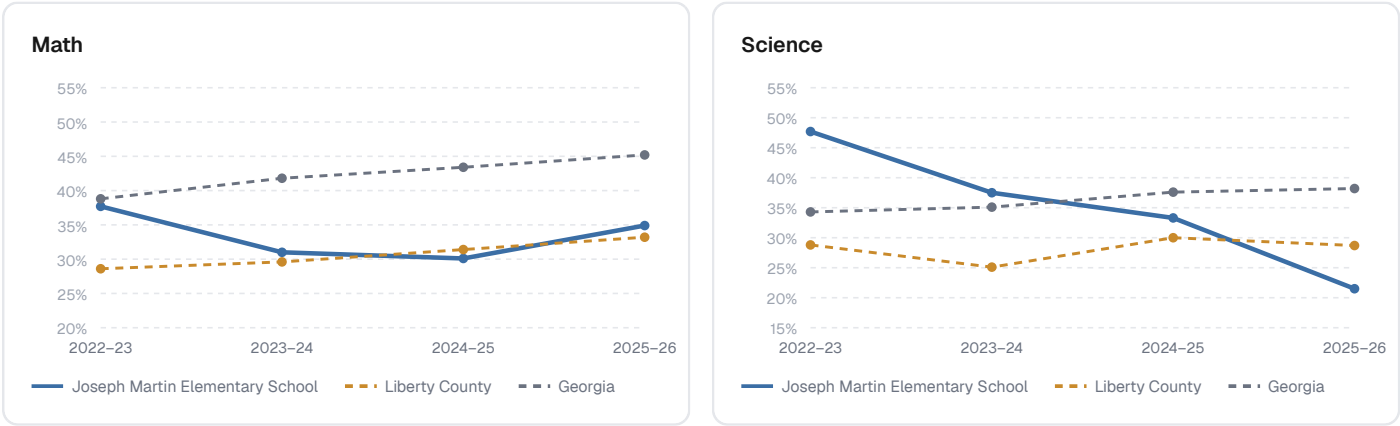
