WHAT STANDS OUT

Findings for 2025–26

Generated directly from the published results — every statement below can be checked against the tables in this report.

Math lost 1.3 points

40.3% of students scored Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, down from 41.6% in 2024–25.

The Students with Disabilities gap in Science widened by 22.2 points

Students with Disabilities sat 6.8 points behind Students without Disabilities in 2024–25, and 29.0 points behind them in 2025–26.

Grade 5 Math lost 9.8 points

30.2% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, down from 40.0% in 2024–25.

Science is 6.1 points below the state

Liberty Elementary School reported 32.1% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26; Georgia reported 38.2%.

Math is 7.1 points above the Liberty County average

40.3% here vs. 33.2% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26.

Grade 4 Math gained 6.3 points

50.4% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, up from 44.1% in 2024–25.

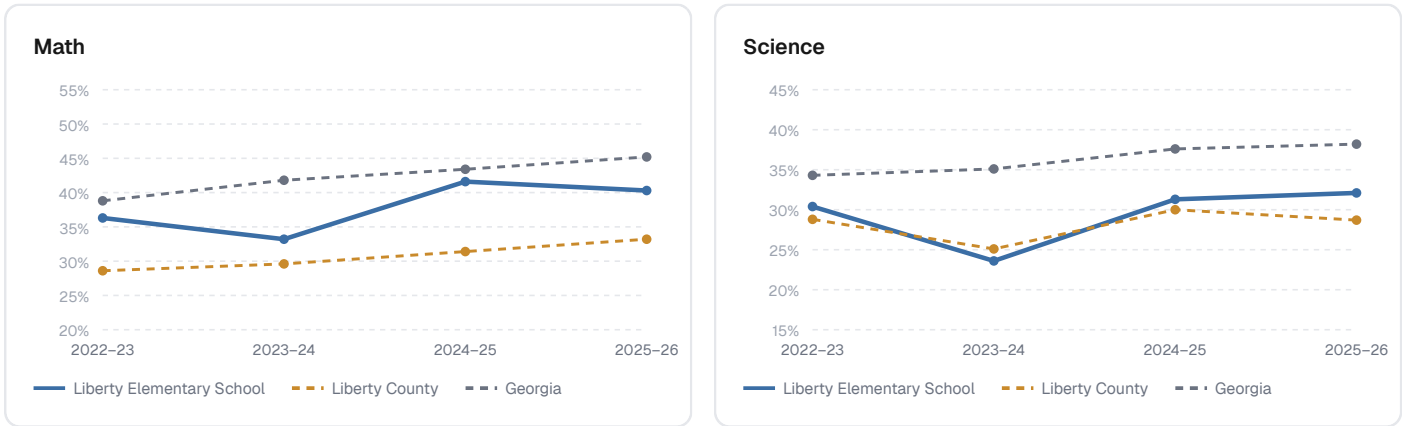
