WHAT STANDS OUT

Findings for 2025–26

Generated directly from the published results — every statement below can be checked against the tables in this report.

Science gained 13.7 points

68.4% of students scored Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, up from 54.7% in 2024–25.

Math has moved in one direction for 4 straight years

46.8% → 62.3% → 63.3% → 69.8% across 2022–23, 2023–24, 2024–25, 2025–26 (+23.0 pts overall).

The Students with Disabilities gap in Math widened by 10.7 points

Students with Disabilities sat 38.0 points behind Students without Disabilities in 2024–25, and 48.7 points behind them in 2025–26.

Grade 5 Math gained 20.1 points

67.5% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, up from 47.4% in 2024–25.

Science is 30.2 points above the state

Taylors Creek Elementary School reported 68.4% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26; Georgia reported 38.2%.

Science is 39.7 points above the Liberty County average

68.4% here vs. 28.7% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26.

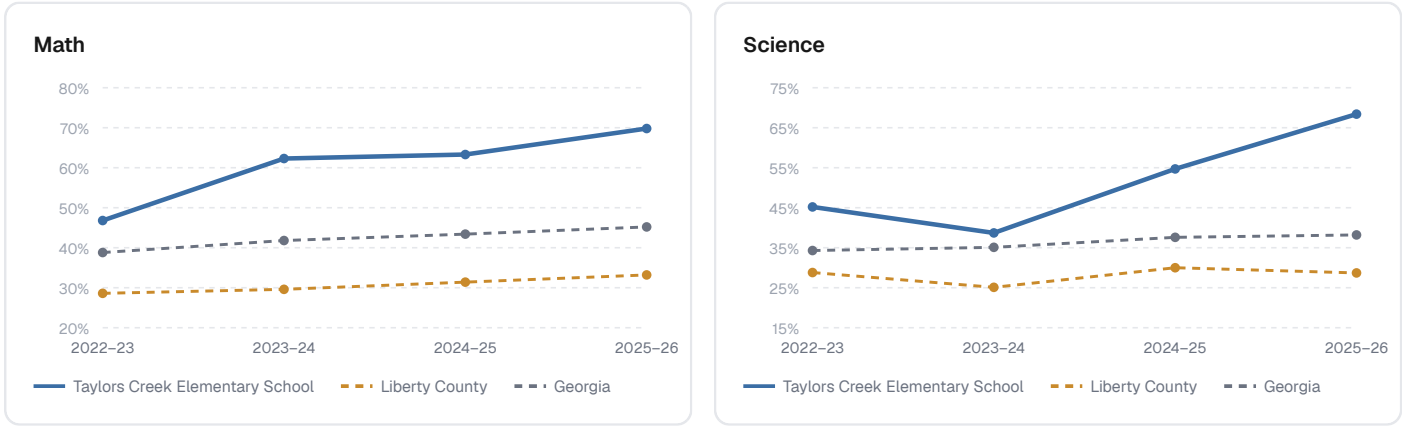
