WHAT STANDS OUT

Findings for 2025–26

Generated directly from the published results — every statement below can be checked against the tables in this report.

Math gained 2.3 points

32.4% of students scored Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, up from 30.1% in 2024–25.

The Limited English Proficient gap in Math narrowed by 24.8 points

Limited English Proficient sat 31.3 points behind Not Limited English Proficient in 2024–25, and 6.5 points behind them in 2025–26.

Grade 4 Math gained 12.7 points

41.0% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, up from 28.3% in 2024–25.

Math is 12.8 points below the state

McClelland Elementary School reported 32.4% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26; Georgia reported 45.2%.

The Students with Disabilities gap in Science widened by 9.9 points

Students with Disabilities sat 24.5 points behind Students without Disabilities in 2024–25, and 34.4 points behind them in 2025–26.

Grade 5 Math lost 8.2 points

23.8% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, down from 32.0% in 2024–25.

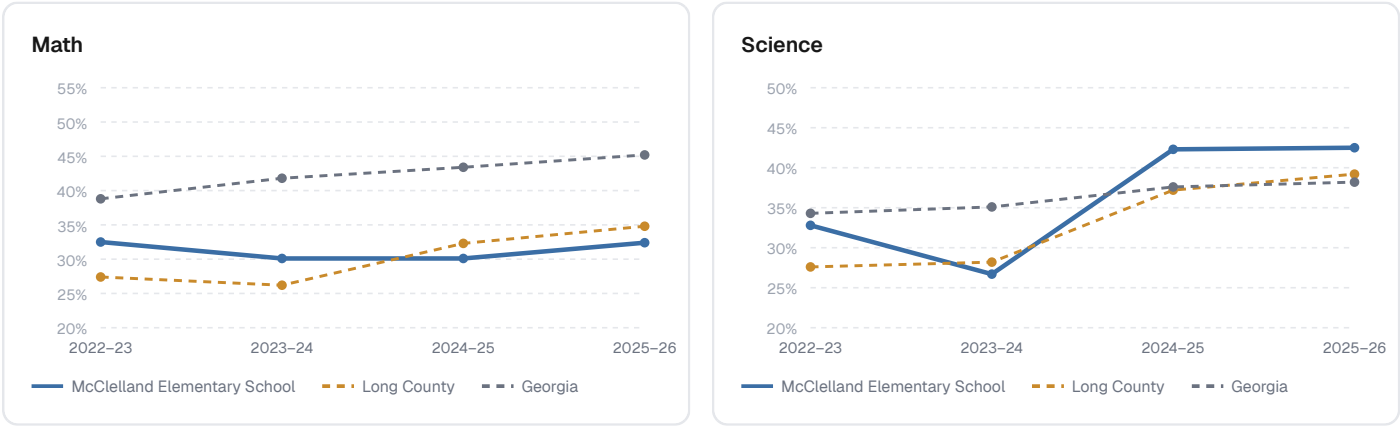
