Findings for 2025–26

Generated directly from the published results — every statement below can be checked against the tables in this report.

Math gained 1.6 points

47.0% of students scored Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, up from 45.4% in 2024–25.

The Limited English Proficient gap in Math widened by 13.4 points

Limited English Proficient sat 16.4 points behind Not Limited English Proficient in 2024–25, and 29.8 points behind them in 2025–26.

Math is 12.2 points above the Long County average

47.0% here vs. 34.8% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26.

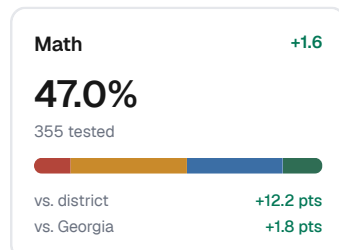
The Students with Disabilities gap in Math narrowed by 8.7 points

Students with Disabilities sat 35.3 points behind Students without Disabilities in 2024–25, and 26.6 points behind them in 2025–26.

Percent of students scoring Proficient or Distinguished, with the change from last year and the distance to the district and state averages.

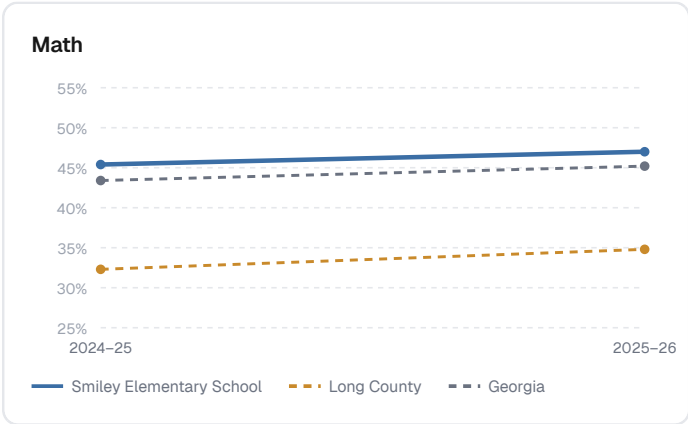
