Findings for 2025–26

Generated directly from the published results — every statement below can be checked against the tables in this report.

Algebra: C&C gained 15.0 points

100.0% of students scored Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, up from 85.0% in 2024–25.

Math has moved in one direction for 4 straight years

30.4% → 32.4% → 38.2% → 38.3% across 2022–23, 2023–24, 2024–25, 2025–26 (+7.9 pts overall).

The Students with Disabilities gap in Science widened by 12.3 points

Students with Disabilities sat 0.7 points behind Students without Disabilities in 2024–25, and 13.0 points behind them in 2025–26.

Grade 8 Math gained 17.7 points

48.6% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, up from 30.9% in 2024–25.

Algebra: C&C is 51.9 points above the state

Hesse School reported 100.0% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26; Georgia reported 48.1%.

Algebra: C&C is 67.2 points above the Savannah-Chatham County average

100.0% here vs. 32.8% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26.
