WHAT STANDS OUT

Findings for 2025–26

Generated directly from the published results — every statement below can be checked against the tables in this report.

Science gained 7.9 points

35.1% of students scored Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, up from 27.2% in 2024–25.

Math has moved in one direction for 4 straight years

17.1% → 23.5% → 29.4% → 35.8% across 2022–23, 2023–24, 2024–25, 2025–26 (+18.7 pts overall).

The Students with Disabilities gap in Math widened by 8.9 points

Students with Disabilities sat 22.9 points behind Students without Disabilities in 2024–25, and 31.8 points behind them in 2025–26.

Grade 4 Math gained 11.3 points

54.9% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, up from 43.6% in 2024–25.

Social Studies is 23.0 points below the state

Rice Creek School reported 17.2% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26; Georgia reported 40.2%.

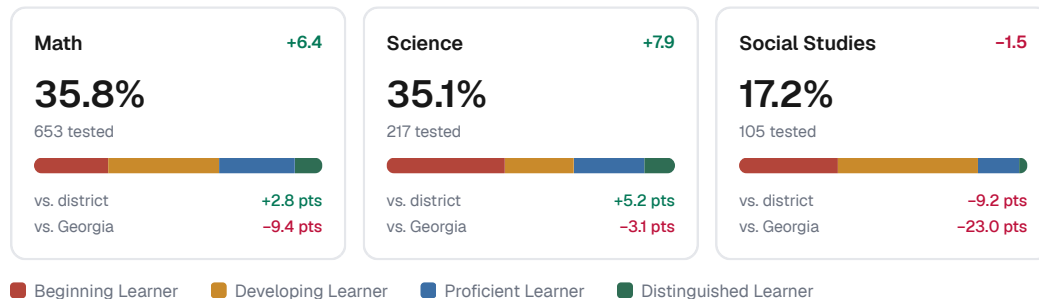
Social Studies is 9.2 points below the Savannah-Chatham County average

Performance by subject

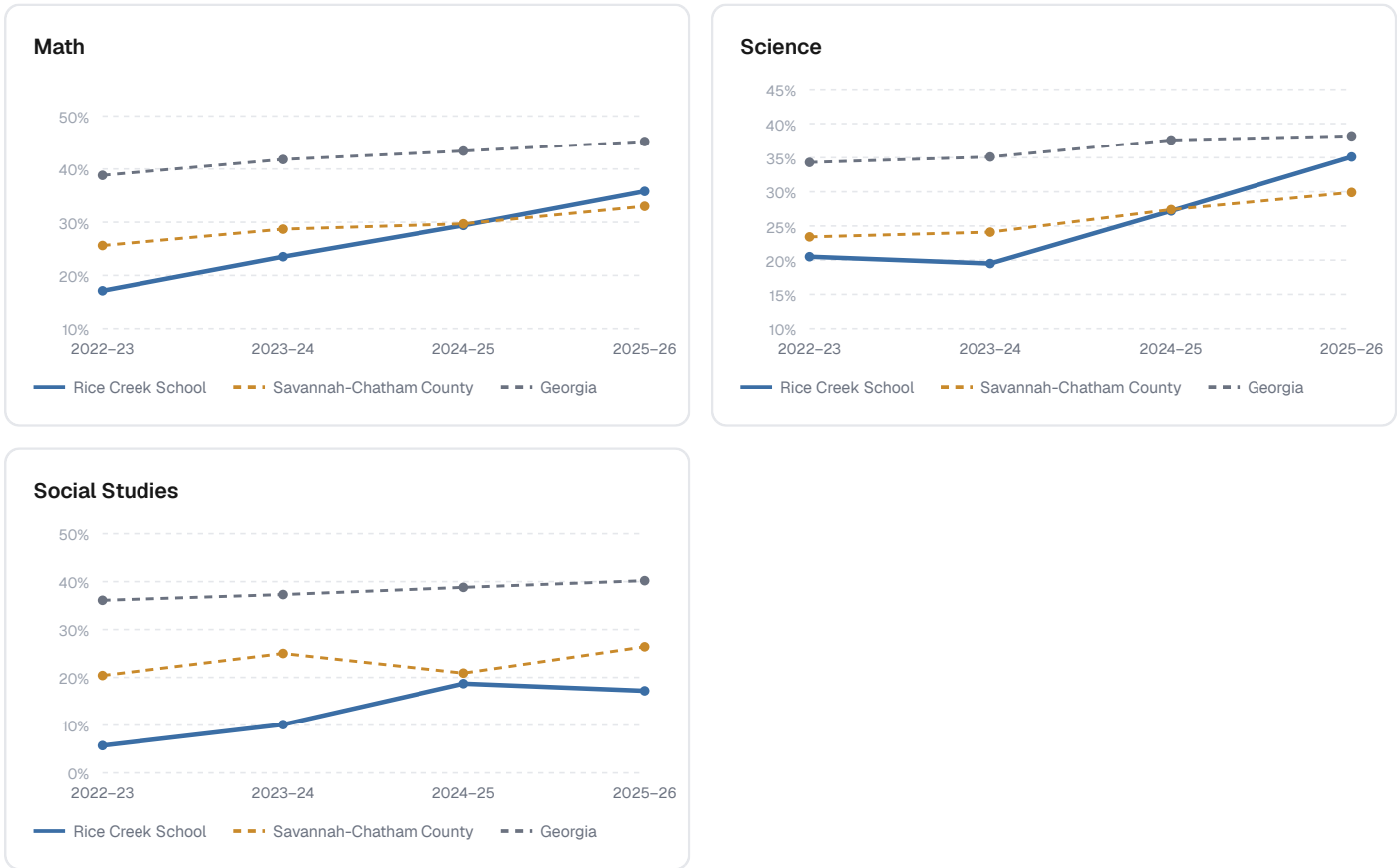
Percent of students scoring Proficient or Distinguished, with the change from last year and the distance to the district and state averages.
