WHAT STANDS OUT

Findings for 2025–26

Generated directly from the published results — every statement below can be checked against the tables in this report.

Algebra: C&C gained 33.4 points

90.5% of students scored Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, up from 57.1% in 2024–25.

The Limited English Proficient gap in Social Studies widened by 8.4 points

Limited English Proficient sat 7.6 points behind Not Limited English Proficient in 2024–25, and 16.0 points behind them in 2025–26.

Grade 8 Math gained 7.7 points

14.5% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, up from 6.8% in 2024–25.

Algebra: C&C is 42.4 points above the state

Southwest Middle School reported 90.5% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26; Georgia reported 48.1%.

Algebra: C&C is 57.7 points above the Savannah-Chatham County average

90.5% here vs. 32.8% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26.

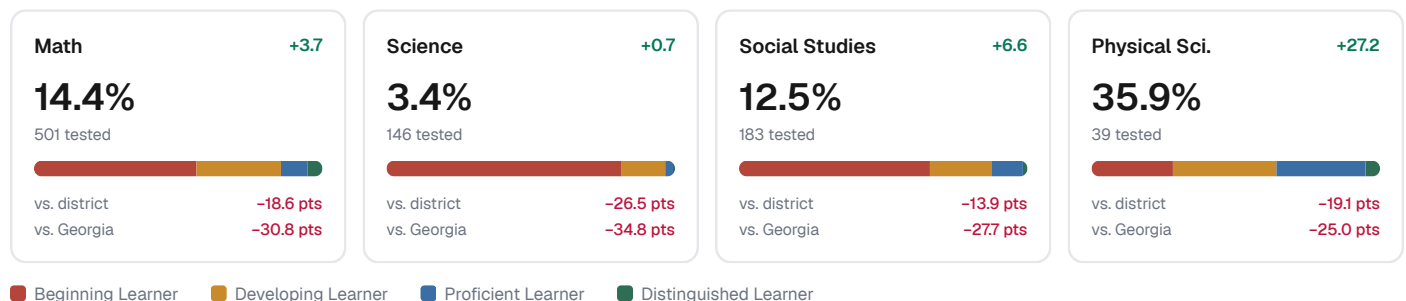
Social Studies gained 6.6 points

12.5% of students scored Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, up from 5.9% in 2024–25.

Performance by subject

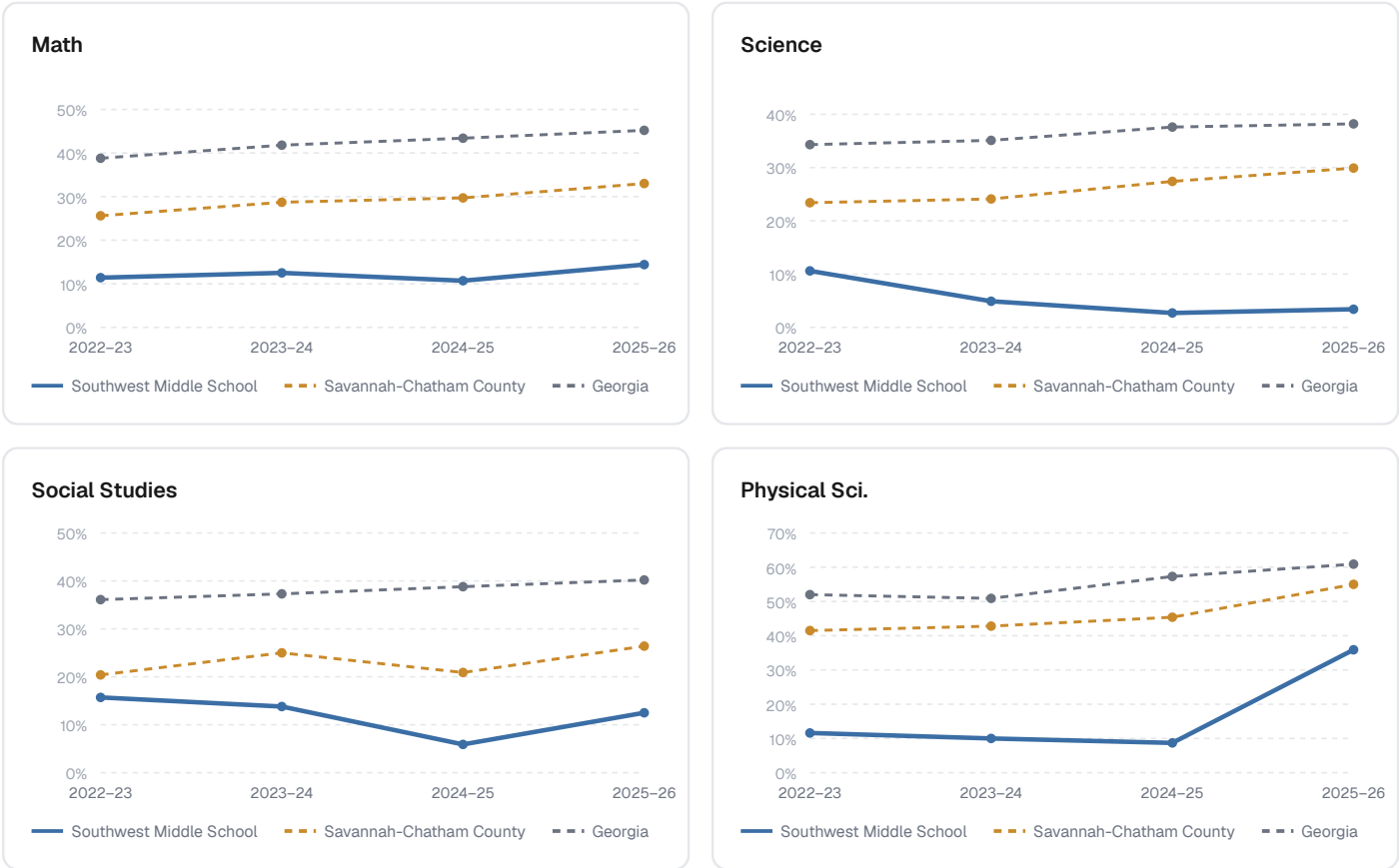
Percent of students scoring Proficient or Distinguished, with the change from last year and the distance to the district and state averages.
