WHAT STANDS OUT

Findings for 2025–26

Generated directly from the published results — every statement below can be checked against the tables in this report.

Science lost 2.8 points

28.9% of students scored Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, down from 31.7% in 2024–25.

Math has moved in one direction for 4 straight years

30.5% → 30.3% → 25.8% → 24.4% across 2022–23, 2023–24, 2024–25, 2025–26 (–6.1 pts overall).

The Students with Disabilities gap in Science narrowed by 12.7 points

Students with Disabilities sat 29.9 points behind Students without Disabilities in 2024–25, and 17.2 points behind them in 2025–26.

Grade 5 Math lost 9.2 points

22.3% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, down from 31.5% in 2024–25.

Math is 20.8 points below the state

Sally Dailey Meadows Elementary School reported 24.4% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26; Georgia reported 45.2%.

Science is 9.2 points above the Vidalia City average

28.9% here vs. 19.7% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26.

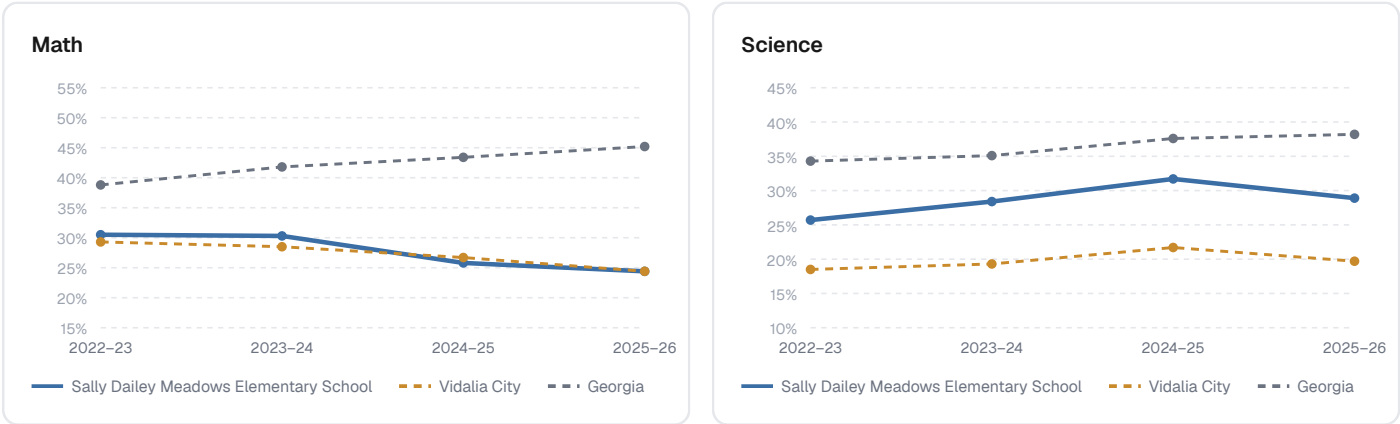
