Findings for 2025–26

Generated directly from the published results — every statement below can be checked against the tables in this report.

Social Studies gained 13.7 points

42.4% of students scored Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, up from 28.7% in 2024–25.

Biology has moved in one direction for 4 straight years

61.9% → 60.1% → 55.7% → 47.8% across 2022–23, 2023–24, 2024–25, 2025–26 (–14.1 pts overall).

The Students with Disabilities gap in US History narrowed by 17.9 points

Students with Disabilities sat 44.3 points behind Students without Disabilities in 2024–25, and 26.4 points behind them in 2025–26.

Grade 8 Social Studies gained 13.7 points

42.4% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, up from 28.7% in 2024–25.

Algebra: C&C is 15.7 points below the state

Wayne County reported 32.4% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26; Georgia reported 48.1%.

Algebra: C&C is 14.6 points below the First District average

32.4% here vs. 47.0% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26.

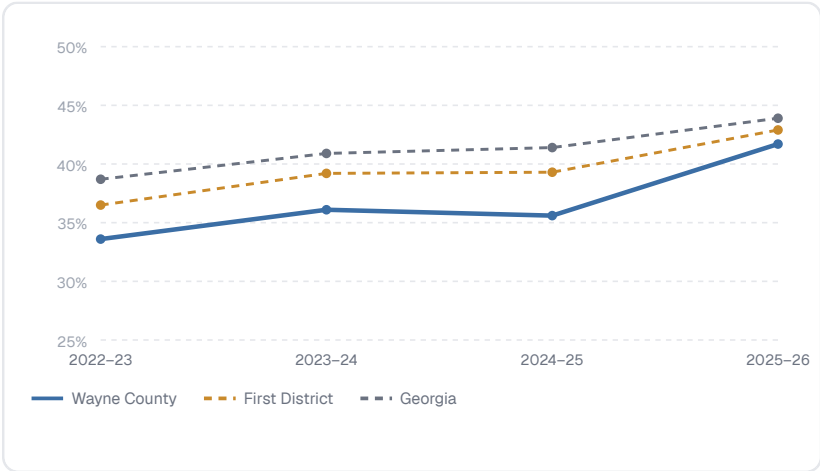

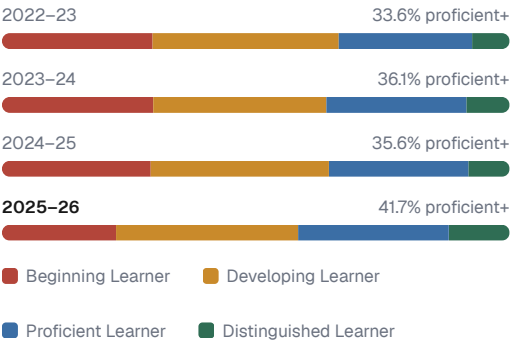
Trend against the region and the state

Georgia changed its end-of-course lineup during this period: Algebra I, American Literature and Composition were replaced by Algebra: Concepts and Connections. Year-over-year comparison across that change is not like-for-like.

"Proficient or Distinguished" combines the top two of Georgia's four achievement levels and is the measure used for grade-level readiness. Cells marked "—" were withheld by the state because the group was too small to report without identifying individual students; they are excluded from averages rather than treated as zero. Where a student group is small, its size is shown beside the percentage and no comparison is drawn — a single student can move such a figure by tens of points, so it should not be read as a trend.
