WHAT STANDS OUT

Findings for 2025–26

Generated directly from the published results — every statement below can be checked against the tables in this report.

Science lost 2.7 points

37.5% of students scored Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, down from 40.2% in 2024–25.

Math has moved in one direction for 4 straight years

31.0% → 31.1% → 36.3% → 36.6% across 2022–23, 2023–24, 2024–25, 2025–26 (+5.6 pts overall).

The Students with Disabilities gap in Math widened by 3.5 points

Students with Disabilities sat 22.5 points behind Students without Disabilities in 2024–25, and 26.0 points behind them in 2025–26.

Grade 3 Math lost 14.2 points

25.5% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, down from 39.7% in 2024–25.

Math is 8.6 points below the state

Jesup Elementary School reported 36.6% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26; Georgia reported 45.2%.

Math is 5.6 points below the Wayne County average

36.6% here vs. 42.2% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26.

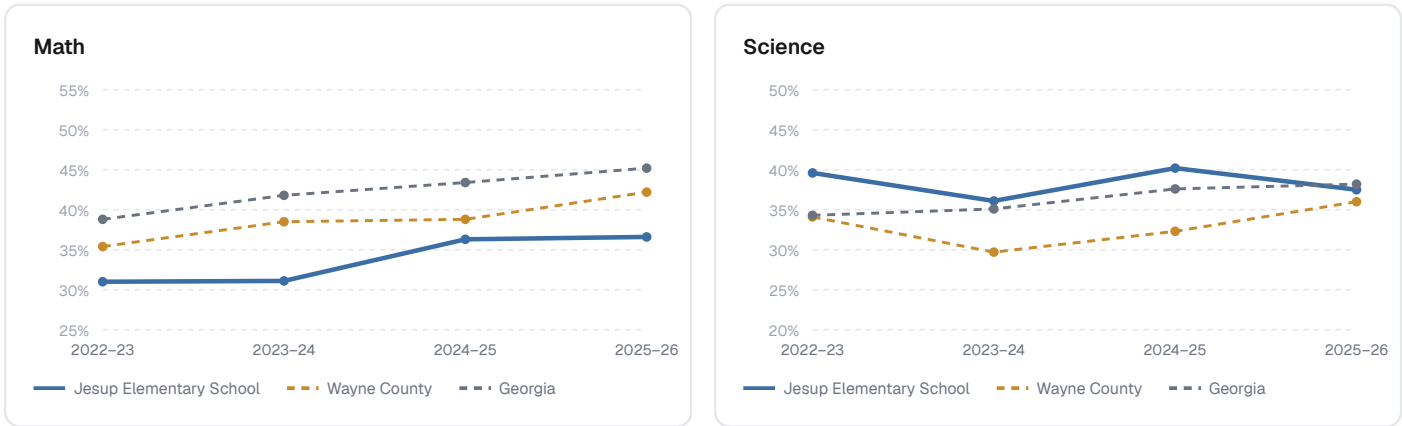
