WHAT STANDS OUT

Findings for 2025–26

Generated directly from the published results — every statement below can be checked against the tables in this report.

Algebra: C&C gained 38.4 points

91.7% of students scored Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, up from 53.3% in 2024–25.

Social Studies has moved in one direction for 4 straight years

25.6% → 28.9% → 36.3% → 47.1% across 2022–23, 2023–24, 2024–25, 2025–26 (+21.5 pts overall).

The Students with Disabilities gap in Science widened by 12.0 points

Students with Disabilities sat 19.7 points behind Students without Disabilities in 2024–25, and 31.7 points behind them in 2025–26.

Grade 8 Science gained 14.5 points

36.2% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, up from 21.7% in 2024–25.

Algebra: C&C is 43.6 points above the state

Martha Puckett Middle School reported 91.7% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26; Georgia reported 48.1%.

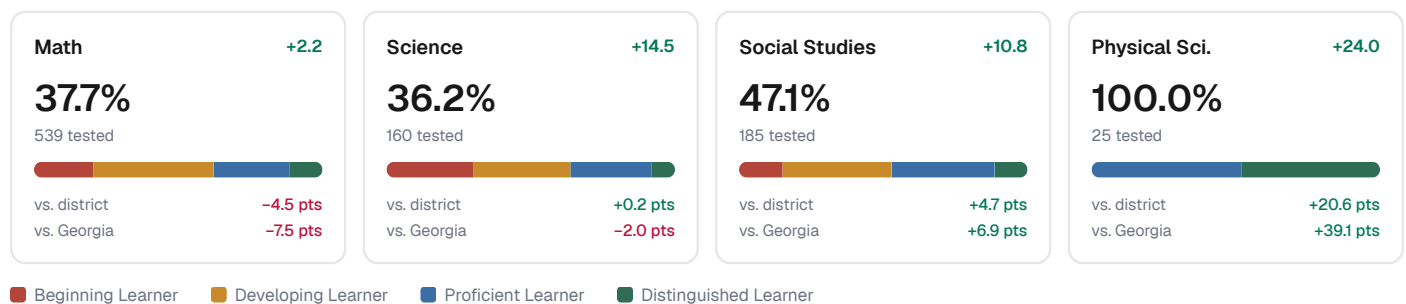
Algebra: C&C is 59.3 points above the Wayne County average

Performance by subject

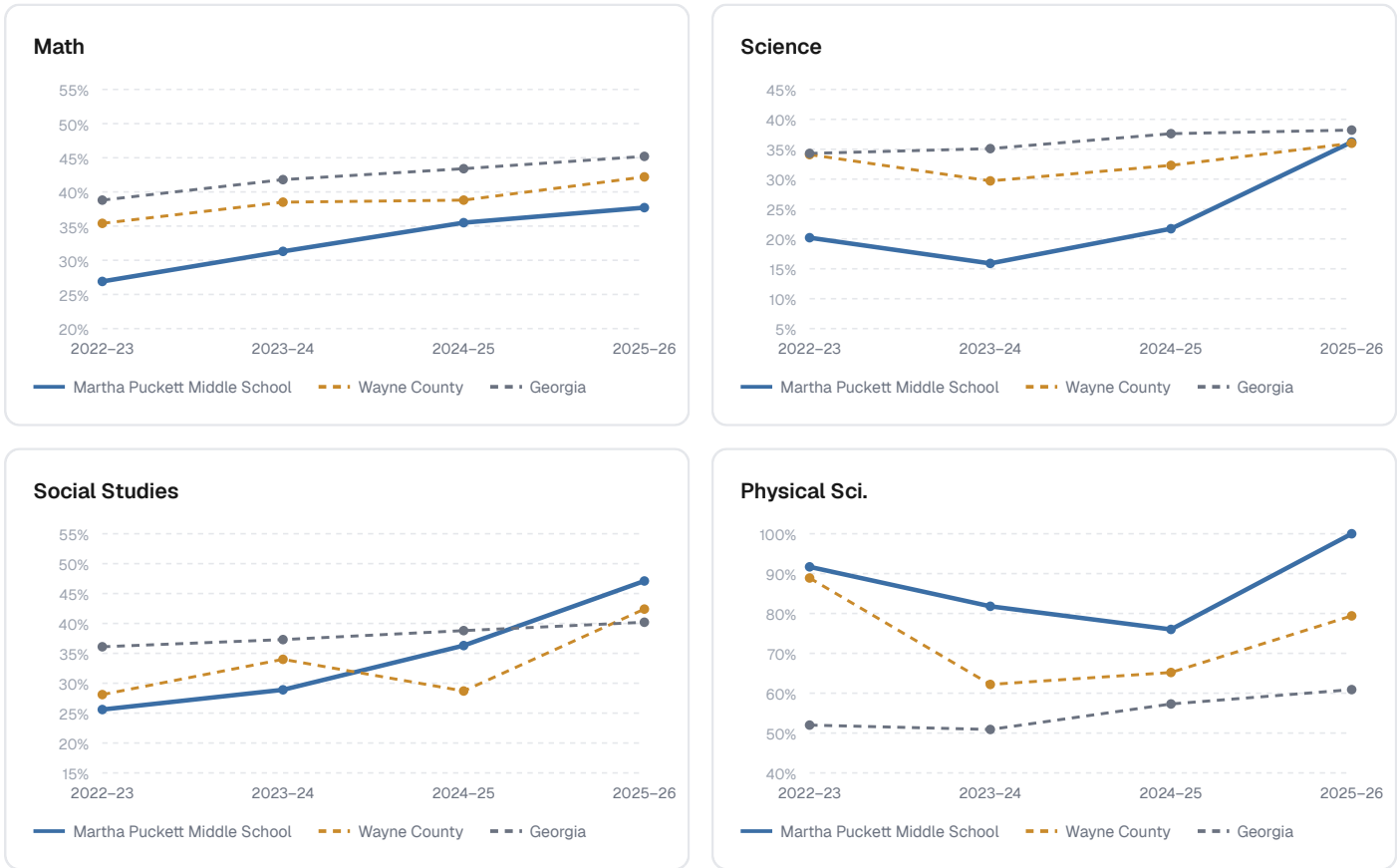
Percent of students scoring Proficient or Distinguished, with the change from last year and the distance to the district and state averages.
