Findings for 2025–26

Generated directly from the published results — every statement below can be checked against the tables in this report.

Science gained 8.0 points

34.9% of students scored Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, up from 26.9% in 2024–25.

The Students with Disabilities gap in Math narrowed by 8.1 points

Students with Disabilities sat 21.1 points behind Students without Disabilities in 2024–25, and 13.0 points behind them in 2025–26.

Grade 5 Math gained 12.1 points

25.3% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, up from 13.2% in 2024–25.

Math is 9.2 points below the state

Martha Rawls Smith Elementary School reported 36.0% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26; Georgia reported 45.2%.

Math is 6.2 points below the Wayne County average

36.0% here vs. 42.2% Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26.

Math gained 5.5 points

36.0% of students scored Proficient or Distinguished in 2025–26, up from 30.5% in 2024–25.

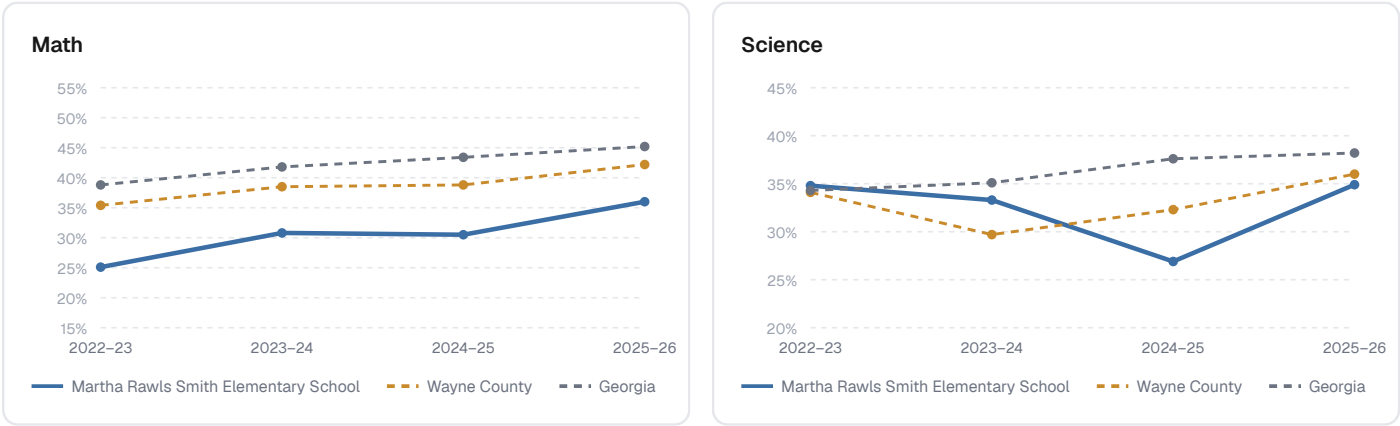
